Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends and Members of Emmanuel,

As I was reviewing several Bible passages the other day, I came across one that seemed to resonate well in the present social political environment. It's from the Old Testament book of Isaiah, chapter 41:10.

"So do not fear, for I am with you, do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you? I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

In addition to the Bible, I read a magazine that's called the "New Yorker". In the September 12, 2016 edition, a book critic, Patrick Radden Keefe, reviewed in an essay entitled "Young Guns", a book titled: Wolf Boys: Two American Teenagers and Mexico's Most Dangerous Drug Cartel by Dan Slater. (Amazon \$10 +)

If you are concerned about teens in America, it would be worth your while to get a copy from the library, or perhaps coop in a purchase-to-share plan with other parents or interested parties. I have a copy and will be lending it at our church.

Please understand that I point this book out, as it is a commentary on how evil and wicked influences are at work in our world. And, that the radicalization of youth, evidenced recently in the Twin Cities, takes place to serve the causes of diabolic world views, and is not restricted to places far away and only imagined to be true.

The final paragraph in the critic's report brings us up to speed: "Cardona and Reta (the two teenagers in the book) are still young, with decades ahead of them for reflection. They may yet come to terms with the wreckage they have caused. In 2013, a team of psychologists at the University of Utah published a paper noting that, while there is extensive academic literature on the indoctrination, rehabilitation, and postconflict trauma of child soldiers abroad, there are few corresponding studies of American children drawn into gang violence. Perhaps they suggested, some of the research lessons gleaned from international studies could be applied to "the child combatants in our own backyard.""

For Slater, the story of Cardona and Reta is, at least in part, an indictment of American obliviousness: a parable about the mutant children, children of the drug war. When Cardona was sentenced in 2009, his lawyer pleaded for something shorter than a life sentence. "I don't know what's in my client's mind," he said, "I'm not Freud. I'm sure Freud would have a field day. I don't know what the motivation was. We don't know what makes him tick. No one seems to really care." (The New Yorker, September 12, 2016 p. 77.)

With all the negative and destructive things that go on in our sinful world, there may be reasons for us to feel the temptation of Satan to wring our hands in fearful hopelessness. So, it is that in our text, we are rescued from such realities by the comforting and powerful words of the only true God. While our anxieties are held at bay by the power of our gracious God, we do well to give ourselves to be active in the prevention of such ideas that would minimize, condone, or otherwise diminish human life as precious and shorten the time of grace God gives us to come to know Jesus as our personal Savior.

Sitting on our hands in smug inactivity is not the same as letting our voices by heard and using our energies, intellect, resources and time to combat the forces of evil and to preserve the truth of God among us. Folding our hands in prayer and joining our hands in unity of purpose and goal should be something we actively pursue. Casting a vote and being responsible for our political choices is also an essential part of Christian freedom and our freedoms as an American.

Please be comforted by the assurance of God and use your ability to read, learn and inwardly digest the circumstances that surround us and within which we move and have our being.

Joyful Noise Preschool has begun its seventeenth year of operation.
