The Importance Of Christianity For Little
Children

The children of the next generation!

We have a wonderful preschool at Emmanuel. Our preschool is sponsored by our Emmanuel congregation and is staffed by devout Christians who believe, teach, and confess that Jesus Christ is the Savior of all. Our preschool is a tuition-based program that is dedicated to training children and preparing them for primary grade school. Our school is based on biblical Christianity. The whole curriculum has as its central core the teachings of the Bible. In fact, every subject taught is presented from the Christian world view. We are not restricted by law to a non-religious curriculum as all state sponsored 4K programs in Wisconsin are.

Under the heading of “social studies”, one of the subjects and life principles we teach is “honesty.” We teach the children about true and false. Additionally, we teach the children what the Bibles says about truthfulness, honesty, and personal integrity. These lessons are foundational. It is extremely important that the lessons parents teach their children about personal character and how to get along in society be reaffirmed by other adults, especially those who are their teachers and role models in their formative years.

We say: “Christian Education doesn’t cost, it pays!” In the Bible, in the book of Proverbs we read: “The godly walk with integrity; blessed are their children who follow them.” (Proverbs 20:7). In view of what our little ones are exposed to, inside and outside of our homes, it is immediately clear that if we don’t train the children or if we leave their spiritual training to later on in their lives, the forces of environment, culture, public figures, false heroes, entertainment and the impact of wicked and corrupt people, our children will continue to emerge as selfish, vindictive, hateful, greedy adults who have no

understanding of how to live in the society of our democratic republic. All we need to do is look at the matters of politics as we know them today and it becomes clear that one generation reaps what the previous generation has sown.

Christian Preschools like Emmanuel's, Joyful Noise Preschool, provide help for parents who want to have their children grow up to be good and honest Christian citizens. We are encouraged by God in the Bible on this matter: "Fathers, do not irritate and provoke your children to anger [do not exasperate them to resentment], but rear them [tenderly] in the training and discipline and the counsel and admonition of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4).

And, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." (Colossians 2:6).

THE ANTI-THEORY OF EVOLUTION

Colossians 2:8: "Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ."

When a well-respected scientist says anything that is critical of Darwinism, two things are bound to happen. First, evolutionists will put pressure on the scientist to retract his comments. The second thing is that creationists will quote the scientist to show that even some scientists understand the weaknesses of

evolution. This is what we are doing on today's broadcast.

In his book *A Different Universe*, Nobel Laureate Robert Laughlin, a professor of physics and applied physics at Stanford University, wrote that evolution is anti-science and actually impedes scientific investigation. Laughlin wrote he is concerned that much "present-day biological knowledge is ideological" and cannot be tested.

Here is an excerpt of what he wrote: "Evolution by natural selection, for instance, which Charles Darwin originally conceived as a great theory, has lately come to function more as an anti-theory, called upon to cover up embarrassing experimental shortcomings and legitimize findings that are at best questionable... Your protein defies the laws of mass action? Evolution did it! Your complicated mess of chemical reactions turns into a chicken? Evolution! The human brain works on logical principles no computer can emulate? Evolution is the cause!"

Now, let me point out that Creation Moments is not saying that Dr. Laughlin rejects evolution. He is merely saying what we have been saying for many years. Evolution is an ideology that is simply assumed to be true. Rather than being a scientific theory, it is an anti-theory that clearly lies outside the realm of true science.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, evolutionists claim that creationists are anti-science. Help them to see that they are the ones who have abandoned true science in favor of a godless ideology.

Meeting The Spiritual Needs of Members in the Military

WELS Military Services Committee, part of the WELS Commission on Special Ministries, held its annual conference in San Antonio, Tex., earlier this month. Each year the committee and military contact pastors from around the synod convene to discuss and learn how to better meet the spiritual needs of members in the military and their families.

The attendees visited the Center for the Intrepid in San Antonio to see how wounded servicemen and women are being rehabilitated to live as normal of a life as possible after serious injuries. The visit gave the military contact pastors and committee a small glimpse into some of the obstacles veterans face when they return from duty.

Another emphasis of the conference was encouraging WELS military contact pastors to get in touch with the military chaplains on the bases to get involved in ministry. While WELS

does not have chaplains officially in the military, the pastors near the bases serve Christians who are serving their country. Mike and Diane Tracy know the importance of military contact pastors first-hand. Mike served in the military for 24 years, moving the family around regularly. Retired from active service since 2009, Mike is on the Military Services Committee, and he and his wife organized the San Antonio event.

“Military families have unique situations that other families don’t have,” says Diane. “Our [spouses] are deployed. We aren’t near our families. It’s a different type of stress added to your relationship. For the pastors to be able to understand how they can better fulfill those needs and have the congregation help fulfill those needs, it’s important.”

She says having a chaplain in Europe was especially meaningful to her family. “We were stationed in Europe. The European Chaplaincy being over there, it gave us a place for our children to be confirmed, it gave us the chance to be able to worship with other WELS Lutherans on a regular basis. That’s the most

important thing a military family can have is spiritual support.” This was the first military contact pastors’ conference Rev. David Parsons, pastor at Holy Cross, Tucson, Ariz., has attended since he took the call earlier this year to Holy Cross, which is near a military base. He says since the conference, he is approaching his military ministry with a new energy and has been speaking with his congregation about ways they could better serve the military families in the Tucson area.

Parsons says, “I really enjoyed the conference. It was eye-opening. They had a good mix of presenters. Hearing stories from the active military guys or stories from the guys who have been out for a while or the military chaplain pastors, just being able to talk to those contact pastors and hear their experiences about what worked and didn’t work—that was beneficial. I’m really excited about the concept of this ministry.”

Diane stresses that military families need solid spiritual support as they face their unique challenges. She says, “The biggest thing that WELS members need to know is if they know

someone in the military, they need to make sure the pastor who lives closest to them and serves their base knows who they are and how to contact them. Because if the chaplains don't know they're out there, they can't help them."
